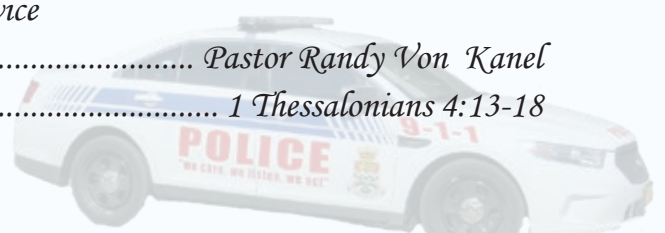

EULOGY of ANTONIO LOPEZ JACKSON

Antonio Lopez Jackson, fondly known as "Jackson", "Action Jackson", "Jacko", "PC Jackson", or "Wacko Jacko", was born on March 14, 1958 in Barrio Marti, Havana Cuba, to Domingo Lopez Fernandez from Spain and Maria Jackson McLaughlin of East End, Grand Cayman. After his father's death, at a very young age, Jackson's mother relocated to Grand Cayman, along with his two brothers and sister. In his adolescent years, his mother moved the family to New York, then on to Philadelphia, where he went to the Benjamin Franklin High School, and Technical Lions Institute where he did electrical training. Before moving back home to Cayman, he worked in the Philadelphia Health Department. Jackson was blessed with a son Antonio Domingo, from his first marriage, who was born in Philadelphia in 1991.

Shortly after, Jackson returned home in 1994, he started working at the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service. Among the course of his service, he served in the Central Police Station, Uniform Support Group, Marine Unit, K9 Unit, Eastern Districts, Process Unit, the Cells, and the Governors House.

Jackson, took pride in his work and gained the support and admiration of many for being respectful, honest and responsible in his duties. He was always willing to help anyone in need. Jackson was also known for his wittiness and forthrightness. If you wanted to know the truth about something, all you had to do was ask him.

On January 5th, 1997, he was married to Karla, and in 2001, they welcomed their long-awaited daughter, Kaesey, and they had a very special bond. As a child, Kaesey loved going on rollercoasters. It was always her dad who pulled the shortest straw and had to accompany her on the rides.

Jackson's absolute favorite hobby was fishing. In particular, he loved spear fishing. He spent many hours on and in the water and he took pride in bringing home his catch to share among his family and friends. Whenever he went fishing, he would tell Karla to have the pot ready to cook the fish and the lobsters that he brought back. Jackson was also known for his culinary skills. Anybody who knew him, knew that he could grill a mean steak. Almost every weekend, you could expect to enjoy a steak dinner at his house, especially if there was an NFL game playing. His favorite team was The Philadelphia Eagles, even though they often lost, he was a loyal fan and always hopeful that they would one day win a Superbowl again.

Jackson will be dearly missed by his wife Karla of 25 years, his daughter Kaesey, his son Tony, and a host of other family members, friends and colleagues.
