Errol Ramoon Obituary

We regretfully announce the passing of Errol Edward Ramoon at age 70, of George Town, Grand Cayman. Errol passed away on 21st July at his home after a long-term struggle with diabetes.

Errol was born to Jane Myles AKA Patsy Ramoon and Robert Seymour AKA Bobby Seymour on 22nd April 1952 in Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands. An independent and strong personality from the beginning, Errol attended Secondary Modern School and was a self-taught electrician.

Errol retired after over 50 years as a self-employed electrician, a trade which he took a liking to in his early teens and would frequently ask his mother for funds to purchase electrical components from Mr. Wilko's shop. He experimented at home with many small electrical projects but got his first job as an electrician working on the first home of his aunt Josephine AKA Marion and uncle Herbert AKA Blinky. He was also known as the neighborhood electrician and was used by many Caymanian families including several in Cayman Brac that would fly him over for their projects.

Errol loved spending time with his Sister Flora, her children Amber, Reshawn and Don and his grandnephew Taron and many Sundays he cooked and invited them over for lunch. He also enjoyed taking long drives with them to North Side and East End to look for mangos and crabs. It was his joy to assist Flora in caring for his niece, nephews and grandnephew when she had to work late nights and on weekends. He also had a special bond with his sister Julie AKA Pat and always reminded her he was the eldest and she would respond "but I am in charge" to which he would respond "okay then I will leave it to you".

Errol also had a love for growing plants as he had a green thumb and loved planting local trees for family and friends. Whenever he travelled to Cayman Brac for work, he would return with many seeds from local plants. He also enjoyed watching US news and cartoons.

Errol is survived by mother Jane AKA Patsy, sisters Julie AKA Pat, Flora, Megan, Ruth, Glennis AKA Girly, Juliette and brothers Fred, Henry, Robert AKA Hacko and Benjamin predeceased by his father Robert AKA Bobby, sister Janet, grandmother Bernice, uncle Charles AKA Sunny and aunts Elaine and Josephine AKA Marion and cousin Herman.
