When Rovyn lived with Aunty Monica he would stop by my mother's home after school to spend some time with us before going up to his house in Nottingham. We both share the same birth year so that means we would experience similar milestones of our lives at the same time. We passed GSAT the same year, we went to high school at the same time and graduated from high school the same year. We basically grew up like siblings. We had many talks, laughs, and even quarrels together but I always loved him like my own brother. I remember Rovyn to be a kind, loving, caring, well-mannered humble, social and outgoing person. He used to love music, food, his phone, his mother (he had a special love for her), his family, girls, taking picture, and social media. He enjoyed talking to people, swimming, going outside the house and enjoying nature even if it is by himself. With his friendly and outgoing personality he was brave to go to the movie alone. He was not afraid to do things. He was adventurous. A true brave king. In fact, I hardly ever seen Rovyn elicit signs of fear.

I remember one evening when I saw him at the bus park talking to girls and I started to interrogate him. He got upset that he told me "when you see me pon the road, avoid me". Shortly after graduation Rovyn came to live at my house for a while before he migrated to Grand Cayman to work. He was so happy and he got a chance to be closer to his parents and grandparents. I was so happy for him. He contacted me regularly and encouraged me to do well in my studies. On visits to Jamaica we would talk and laugh like he never left. One childhood memory that I always remember is when we were playing in the back yard on a guava tree. I stated the last person to reach the top of the tree is the loser. He began racing to the top and held one of the tree branches that shifted and the sharp edge scraped my chest. It began to bleed and I started to cry. I knew when it healed there would be big scar. I still have the scar today and wear it happily. It will always remind me of the childhood that I shared with my beloved cousin Rovyn. I will always love Rovyn and hold on dear to the memories we shared. Most of all I will try to emulate the kindness and love he extended to the people around him. I love you Rovyn, Rest in eternal peace.
