Life Story of Joseph Reynold Ebanks

Joseph Reynold Ebanks was born at West End, Cayman Brac on August 3rd, 1934, to parents Nathan and Alda Ebanks. He was preceded by death by his parents, his sisters, Anessia Adell Scott (Nessie), Daisy Ebanks and brothers, Alvin and Robert. He was the second child of 9 children.

Reynold attended various schools during his early years. He met his wife Annelee in 1954 and they were joined in holy matrimony on December 29th, 1956. From this union came one Son, Barry. In December 1995, he and his wife decided, with the agreement of her mother, to raise Mirta Walton who became their daughter.

At age 15, he began his seaman's career by sailing on various ships owned by the Kirkconnell Shipping Company. At the age of 17, he joined the National Bulk Carriers in the early 1950's and sailed with them for around 25 years in various positions, rising to the level of Third Mate. He also served as Captain on smaller fishing vessels that would sail between the Cayman Islands and Jamaica. His seaman's career took him to all parts of the world and on many ships, including the Ulysses, the Petro King, the Bulkoceanic, the Prince, the Meteor, the Neptune, the Regent, the Emperor, the Chief, the Petro Pan, the Jupiter and the Commonwealth to name a few, After his time with the National Bilk Carriers, he also sailed with the Dantzler's Shipping Company on the Hollis Hedberg for a period from the mid to late seventies. He also worked with Cayman Energy during the 1980s when the ship-to-ship oil transfers were taking place in Cayman Brac.

After his sea career was finished, he joined the Cayman Islands Public Works department and worked with them for fourteen years on various projects both in Cayman Brac and Little Cayman. After retiring, he kept himself busy providing painting services, fishing, farming, processing crab meat, taking care of the upkeep of the home and assisting his wife with her silver thatch craft work by keeping her supplied with rolls of plaiting. Reynold was an ambitious and hard-working man and part of that special group of men often referred to as Iron Men on Wooden Ships.

He was a loving, caring and devoted husband for 67 years. He loved his son and daughter very much and always ensured that they were taken care of. He adored and loved his 3 grandchildren and his 6 great-grandchildren and would always look forward to seeing them in person and speaking to them via video and audio calls. He spent last Christmas in Grand Cayman with all his family and grandchildren and great grandchildren, which was very special for him.

Reynold was a keen follower of news events and kept up with international events, politics and the weather. He also loved watching professional wrestling and would look forward to the upcoming WWE PPV events with great anticipation. He enjoyed watching certain game shows with his wife every evening. Music always made him happy, and he was a great dancer in his earlier years. Reynold had many friends and was well loved by everyone.

In May of this year, Reynold decided to give his life to the Lord. Present on this momentous occasion were Pastor Wood, his wife, his son and niece, Juliana.

On January 2, 2022, Reynold suddenly became ill and after a week at the Faith Hospital, he was transferred to Health City where he remained for 3 months. After being discharged from Health City at the end of March 2022, he spent a few months with his family in Grand Cayman before returning to the Brac in July 2022. During his frequent stays in the hospital, he remained positive and strong, always wanting to know when he would be able to return home and get under that naseberry tree. His family and friends were grateful for the time that they got to spend with him at home and at the hospital. During the period of his illness, he received excellent health care from the doctors and staff at Health City, Health Services Authority (Grand Cayman and Faith Hospital, Cayman Brac) and Caring Hands, in addition to the care provided by his wife, son, daughter and immediate family members, his caregivers, Petrina Grant and Beverly Mitchell also provided excellent and attentive care and became very close to him.


Reynold passed away suddenly on the afternoon of September 15th 2023 at the Faith Hospital, Cayman Brac.
