

Ernie Curt Scott, JP

April 21, 1956 - May 12, 2025

LIFE STORY

Ernie Curt Scott was born in Cayman Brac on the 21st day of April 1956. He was the fourth child and second son to his proud parents, Earla and Eldeen Scott of West End, Cayman Brac. As a young boy, Ernie was loving, kind and very responsible, oftentimes being the protective big brother and carer of twin siblings Doyle and Dana. Many times, when his father was out at sea and his mother had to leave the family home in the Cotton Tree Land, Ernie would tie two of his mother's belts together and attach them to the door lock to rock his two siblings in a homemade hammock, while giving each one their bottle of milk. He would remain there until his mother returned and always reported how Doyle finished his bottle, threw it out of the hammock and tried to take Dana's, which was still unfinished. Needless to say, he would always make sure that did not happen! As he grew older, Ernie and his siblings spent time with their father and helped build their father's catboat. This was used for many fishing trips as well as many enjoyable picnics at sea with family and neighborhood friends. A couple of years later, Ernie built his own skiff which he used for fishing trips.

From his early years, Ernie attended Sunday School, youth/prayer meetings and Bible school at the West End Baptist Church along with his siblings, mother and numerous friends. Ernie accepted Christ as his Saviour during his teenage years with baptism following. It was around that same period that Ernie developed his love of music and was given his first guitar for his 13th birthday. Coming from a musically talented family (the Tatums), he taught himself to play guitar, and throughout his life, he used his talent to sing and play in church events, in various bands, and at community events. The annual Senior Citizens Christmas Party was an event where the seniors particularly looked forward to being entertained by Ernie's gospel and country songs.

Ernie from the outset had a thirst for learning, and attended West End Primary School at age 6 years, completing his classes as a top student. He then attended the Secondary Modern School (later known as Cayman Brac High School, and most recently renamed Layman E. Scott Sr. High School), obtaining eight passes in external Cambridge exams. His parents instilled in him the importance of going to school and studying, and Ernie embraced his learning opportunities, excelling during his primary, secondary and tertiary education.

At the tender age of 17 years, Ernie began his career with the Cayman Islands Government in the Customs Department as a Clerical Officer at District Administration. His career would span over four decades and involve training overseas in Trinidad, Jamaica and the United Kingdom. He rose from an entry level post to the rank of Customs Officer, Senior Customs Officer, Deputy Collector of Customs, Deputy District Commissioner, and District Commissioner, a position he held for his last 14 years as a civil servant. During his tenure as District Commissioner, Ernie provided strong leadership to his staff and community, particularly during the aftermath of Hurricane Paloma in 2008, during which he was instrumental in the Sister Islands rebuilding and recovery efforts. Other career highlights include welcoming the Earl of Wessex to Little Cayman in 2016 and the Prince of Wales, who visited Cayman Brac in 2019. Altogether, Ernie dedicated a total of 47 plus years to the Cayman Islands Government and Sister Islands Community before his retirement in April 2021.

In July 1978, Ernie was joined in marriage to Guianna Grant. To this union two children were born: Tamra and Tanner, whom he loved dearly. He was also a proud grandfather to Tamra's two children, Josiah and Roshaun, whom he showered with love. Ernie was indeed a supportive father and encouraged his children in all their endeavours. Although Ernie and Guianna went their separate ways in 2012, they continued to share a deep love for their precious children and grandchildren.

Ernie was an entrepreneur and spent time after retirement managing his Salon "Glamour" which was especially known for the excellent barber services provided to the community. He would often be seen there conversing with his customers and friends.

As previously noted, Ernie loved the ocean, and every opportunity he got he would spend time on the water with his father and brothers, or friends, line fishing or spear fishing. During his younger years, he also enjoyed setting fish pots with his father, brothers, uncles and other buddies.

Playing dominoes with friends and family in the community was one of Ernie's favorite hobbies, especially after retirement. Cooking closely followed as another one of Ernie's passions; he would often prepare special meals, which he invited family and friends to enjoy. On many occasions he would host barbecues with his friend Conroy.


In late 2024, Ernie's health declined suddenly, and in early 2025 he and his family learned of his terminal illness. He was treated at the Faith Hospital and at Health City Cayman Islands before returning to Faith Hospital in April 2025. Ernie's health continued to deteriorate, and on the morning of May 12th, 2025, he quietly left this earth with his sister by his side and went to be with his Heavenly Father. During his time of illness, Ernie assured that his family of his strong faith in Jesus and his mind was at peace with God.


Ernie was a very special person and was especially loved by his siblings, children, grandchildren, extended family and the wider community.
