LIFE STORY OF BENTLEY CARVEL MCLEAN

March 16th, 1935 – June 2nd, 2025

Bentley Carvel McLean, Seaman, Painter, Cook better known as "Benny" of "Benny Gray" was succumbed to Pulmonary Embolism and peacefully passed away at the age of 90 years 3months on 2nd June 2025. Benny was born on March 16th, 1935 in Cayman Brac and was the only child born to Pauline Louise McLean better known as "Pearly" and Charles Gray.

Benny attended school as did most children in the Brac those days and received a tertiary education.

Benny dedicated most of his life to the sea spending days on end without setting foot on land. His Maritime career began in his late teens when he joined the ship Ulysses as a Messman in November 1954. As a seaman he worked his way from Messman to Chief cook which he thoroughly enjoyed.

During one of his visits back home, and after a short courtship at the age of 20 years on the 28 December 1955 he was united in Marriage to Mervine Brown, better known as "Jeanie" the daughter of the late Christiannell Martin better known as "Nelly" and Orvin Charles Brown. To this union four children was born, Gloria Lewis, Charles McLean, Carvel McLean and Julie Meinert.

The ships he sailed on were the Petro King, Petro Explorer, Ore Conway, Percy Jordan and Harold Helm. He also worked on vessels associated with Kirkconnell shipping including the Kirk Trader, Kirk B and the Kirk Pride.

Throughout his career he recounted many experiences from life at sea. He often spoke of the challenges posed by rough waters, explaining how he had to secure the pots in the kitchen to prevent them from toppling over. Additionally, he assisted fellow seamen by reading and writing letters for those who were unable to do so themselves.

As most seamen told their stories from their experiences at sea, one particular story stands out which took place in Jamaica while the ship was docked. Dock workers unloading cargo would frequently hang their clothes near the kitchen despite his warnings against doing so... frustrated by their disregard he placed cowitch into their clothing, that evening he witness the workers jumping into the water in an attempt to relieve their discomfort. After this incident they discontinued this practice.

After he stopped going to sea, he worked in Grand Cayman in the construction industry an also for H.E. Arch Jr and Sons with Mr. Kevin Schirn and Ted Schirn.

When Benny retired in Grand Cayman he moved to the Brac, shortly thereafter he joined PWC in Little Cayman as a cook and painted whenever needed.

After leaving Little Cayman went back to the Brac, he then worked on projects with his son at McLean Construction from time to time.

Few of Bennys' hobbies were Fishing, clearing and burning brush to prepare the ground for planting, and of course cooking. Benny often cooked for people who often stopped by the house for a meal or just to talk about politics, current events and a fair attempt to solve the worlds' problems.

On occasion through the years, he would visit Ebenezer Baptist Church.

He was honored on Hero's Day 2021 for his Seafaring Heritage where his career advanced in rank to the highest level of his profession from Messman to Chief Cook.
